- 1. Roll Call
- 2. Introduction of guests:
  - Makaila Moulden introduced herself as a new Independent Living Specialist with Wyoming Independent Living.
  - Dominique Maestas introduced herself as representing Wyoming Relay Service.
- 3. <u>Minutes from April 23, 2020 Meeting</u> A motion was made by John Wall and seconded by Ardell Breed to approve the minutes. The minutes were approved by the Council members.

#### 4. Old Business:

- Money Handling Policies & Procedures Renate Pullen made a motion to approve the Money Handling Policies & Procedures with all attachments and sheets, and this was seconded by John Wall. The Money Handling Policies & Procedures were approved by the Council.
- QOL Committee Zulima Lopez, Chairperson
  - O Zulima was able to upload the Transportation Survey into Survey Monkey. The intention of the survey is to establish priority needs in the community regarding transportation. The Council decided to have the survey available for 90 days to gather as many responses as possible. It was suggested using a press release, a link on the City's website as well as a link on the Council's Facebook page. Charlie Powell will follow up on possibly having the survey or insert added into the City's utility bills and will email Zulima with follow up.
  - Some members met with Leann Miller of the Community Greenhouse Project the morning of May 28<sup>th</sup> regarding the project. Some options need vetted out and Sub-Committee Chairs will be scheduled to meet

with Leann Miller regarding how the Council could partner moving forward and involve the disability community in the project.

- Public Relations (PR) Committee John Wall, Chairperson
  - O John Wall John has been reaching out to Leann Miller himself, and Department of Vocational Rehabilitation to see how the Council can partner moving forward. High prices of food during COVID-19 are an issue. He's hoping to meet with Wyoming Independent Living and Department of Vocational Rehabilitation as well as Community Greenhouse Project to use as an agricultural tool and educational tool for individuals with disabilities.
  - o City of Casper Webpage for the Council: This is pending.
- Events Committee Nikki Green, Chairperson
  - o Given the current circumstances with COVID-19 and major events cancelled throughout the summer, it was decided that no in-person events should be scheduled at this time. It was decided to do an online campaign in recognition of the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the signing of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) into law. The anniversary date is July 26, 2020. It was mentioned to do some posting on Facebook as well as a PSA and Mayor's Proclamation.
- Fundraising Committee Linda Jones, Chairperson
  - O Austin Berlin provided an update from Linda as she wasn't able to join the meeting via technology. Suggestions for upcoming fundraising options included a 2021 calendar that the Council can sell or GoFundMe page. It was noted that the GoFundMe page would not likely be an option due to the government affiliation with the City, but Zulima will look into it. It also would be difficult without a specific project or reason for the donations. It was decided we'd have more information once the transportation surveys were completed.

#### 5. New Business:

- Treasurer's Financial Report Zulima updated the Council that the CCPD now has business cards to distribute once we meet in person again. They can be mailed if needed. Envelopes have arrived as well. Expenses have been paid for these items. The remaining balance is \$573.19 of the original budget of \$2000 for this fiscal year.
- Participation in the Governor's Council on Developmental Disabilities conference scheduled for July 30-31, 2020 in Casper - A keynote speaker comes in and breakout sessions occur, and it would be nice to have a booth at this event to share information about the CCPD. The vendor

booth cost is \$150.00. Discussion occurred whether this might be cancelled due to other major events being cancelled during the summer. A motion was made by Michelle Onstott to table this decision on participation until the June 25<sup>th</sup> meeting, and it was seconded by John Wall and approved by the Council.

- John Wall let the Council know that June 19<sup>th</sup> is a meeting of the State Vocational Rehabilitation Council, and he should be able to visit with Aleyta Zimmerman regarding the Governor's Council on DD Conference and update the CCPD.
- O Michelle Onstott let the CCPD group know that Cheryl Junge with the school district is retiring. Her retirement celebration is June 4<sup>th</sup> from 4-5 PM on Zoom, and there is a driveway gathering to respect social distancing from 4-6 PM on June 4<sup>th</sup>. Michelle will email the information to Zulima to forward to the Council.
- Ardell Breed asked about the Council liaison appointment to the CCPD, and Zulima reported that this position is appointed by the Mayor.
- It was discussed that the next meeting will most likely be held via WebEx due to COVID-19.

### Casper's Council of People with Disabilities Seeks Data on Access to Transportation for the Disabled Community

Information will help establish CCPD priorities for future transportation-related projects

Casper, Wyoming (June 1, 2020) – Casper's Council of People with Disabilities (CCPD) is seeking information from the disabled community about current transportation use, challenges regarding transportation access, and the likelihood of using various transportation alternatives in the future.

Casper's Council of People with Disabilities is comprised of volunteer citizens appointed by the Casper City Council, who work together as an advisory board that operates as a catalyst for promoting self- advocacy, equality, accessibility, and opportunity for all people, regardless of their disability. The CCPD serves as an advisory body to the City Council. One priority of the CCPD is to expand transportation availability for disabled citizens, which would improve access to food, healthcare, shopping, community events, and social interactions. "Access to reliable, safe, and affordable transportation is an essential factor in anyone's quality of life," says Austin Berlin, the CCPD chairperson. "Transportation can be the difference between a life of freedom and self-sufficiency and a life of isolation and limitation."

The CCPD will gather transportation data via an online survey, which will run from June 1, 2020 through August 31, 2020. Paper surveys are also available upon request. Results will be compiled in September for discussion at a regular CCPD monthly meeting this fall. "It is important to gather this information to help us focus our resources on transportation-related projects and initiatives that can have the most impact in our community," explains Berlin.

Chairman Coleman called the meeting to order at 10:01 a.m.

- 1. Chairman Coleman asked for a motion to approve the minutes from the June 6, 2018 meeting. A motion was made by Vice Chairman Catellier and seconded by Board Member Bogart to approve the minutes of the June 6, 2018 meeting. Motion passed.
- 2. Mr. Martin asked the Committee to reference the 2018-2019 Cost Schedule as of March 31, 2019. Mr. Martin stated that the Cost Schedule shows the actual budget spent for the first three quarters of the fiscal year, which were all less than the anticipated Quarterly Budget. Mr. Martin stated that since the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter is not over yet, no expense totals are shown. Vice Chairman Catellier asked if this is standard procedure to leave the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter showing no expenses. Mr. Martin stated that it is, as it is difficult to estimate the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter expenditures.
- 3. Mr. Martin asked the Committee to reference the Five Year Flow Measurements. Mr. Martin stated that each meter station has an ultrasonic flow meter that is monitored continuously by the WWTP Operators. Mr. Martin stated that the flows are recorded daily and the meter is calibrated monthly. Mr. Martin stated that if anything doesn't look right on the readings, the meter is checked.
- 4. Mr. Martin asked the Committee to reference the Budget Narrative for Fiscal Year 2020. Mr. Martin stated that staff has made serious efforts to minimize increases in the FY20 WWTP Operations budget. Mr. Martin stated due to these efforts, most minor operational line items are unchanged from FY19; however, increases will be seen in Personnel, Contractual Services, and Debt Service Costs.

Mr. Martin stated that the WWTP Budget is driven by new and replacement capital projects much more than by operational expenditures. Mr. Martin stated that the new and replacement capital expenditures generally follow the WWTP Fund 10-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). Mr. Martin stated that the CIP has been updated to contain projects identified in the recent WWTP Preliminary Facilities Plan.

Mr. Martin reviewed the Preliminary WWTP FY20 Budget:

#### Revenue

- a) Septic Tank/Commercial Sump Waste Charges \$310,000 and \$120,000 This is a \$10,000 increase for Septic Tank Waste Charge revenue and an increase of \$48,000 for Sump Waste Charge revenue. There has recently been an increase in hauled waste received at the WWTP.
- b) Intergovernmental User Charges \$5,754,359 This represents an increase of \$302,081 from the FY19 Budget. These revenues are budgeted for wholesale sewer usage of the Regional Wastewater System in accordance to the cost accounting formula in the "Interagency Agreement."

Committee Member Haigler arrived at 10:08 a.m.

#### Personnel Services

a) Personnel Costs - \$1,426,328 – This is an increase of \$45,576 from the FY19 budget. The increase can mainly be contributed to reinstated step increases and elimination of interdepartmental transfer of personnel fees as they are now a direct line item charge.

#### **Contractual Services**

- a) Refuse Collection \$50,000 This amount is unchanged from the FY19 budget. This includes both garbage service and disposal of dried grease and industrial waste.
- b) Interdepartmental Services \$486,870 The FY20 budget represents an increase of \$182,162 from the FY19 budget. This line item represents transfers to the General Fund for services such as Central Garage, Administrative Services, Information Technology, City Administration, and City Attorney Fees.
- c) Administration and Management Fees \$123,515 These fees (Sewer Collection Charges, Sewer Administration Charges, and PSD Administration Charges) are calculated and allocated out to the Wholesale Customers per the Regional Wastewater System "Interagency Agreement."
- d) Energy Natural Gas \$71,000 This line item is unchanged from FY19.
- e) Energy Electricity \$350,000 This line item is unchanged from FY19.

#### Materials and Supplies

- a) Chemicals \$432,000 This line item is unchanged from FY19.
- b) Other Materials and Supplies \$138,500 This amount is unchanged from the FY19 budget. This covers the following:

•	Office Supplies –	\$ 3,000 – Paper, Toner, Etc.
•	Other Materials & Supplies –	\$ 5,000 – General Expenses

c) Instrumentation - \$25,000 – This amount is unchanged from the FY19 budget.

a) Depreciation - \$750,000 – This amount is unchanged from FY18.

a) Principal Payment - \$702,447 - This reflects the Principal amounts for four CWSRF loans per the amortization schedules.

b) System Development Charges – \$190,000 – This is an increase of \$103,000 from the FY19 budget. Projections are based on the new system investment charges implemented in January.

#### Capital – New

a) Improvements Other Than Buildings – None for FY20.

- b) Intangibles \$50,000 Based on recommendations from the March CPU Advisory Board meeting, this is a placeholder for potential projects brought forward by the Natrona County Conservation District, which aid in selenium reductions and delisted the river.
- c) Light Equipment \$5,000 This is for specialized tools and equipment needed for the WWTP equipment and unit processes.
- d) There are no budget expenditures for New Capital Buildings, Heavy Equipment, or Technologies this year.

#### <u>Capital – Replacement</u>

- a) Buildings \$155,000 This is for the following:
  - Lighting Renovations \$30,000 This will upgrade lighting fixtures in several areas of the facility to LED lights.
  - Security Improvements \$30,000 The installation of security enhancements for several City owned facilities, including the WWTP, took place in FY14. This will cove additional needs including secure doors to several of the buildings.
  - Miscellaneous Building Painting \$15,000 External and internal painting of several of the WWTP Buildings would take place. In most cases the work would be accomplished by WWTP personnel.
  - Digester Control Building Roof Replacement \$80,000 The Digester Control Building roof has passed its useful life and will be replaced in FY20. There have been roof replacements done for the past several years.
- b) Improvements Other Than Buildings \$9,432,000 This includes:
  - NPSS Rehabilitation Project \$8,000,000 This project is to rehabilitate several severely corroded sections of the NPSS based off of the condition assessment completed in 2012. The project is to be funded with an SRF loan with 25% Principal Forgiveness, 2.5% Interest.
  - Sludge Grinder \$10,000 The WWTP has several sludge grinders used to shred sludge to make it easier to pump and not plug sludge lines.
  - Lab Equipment \$12,000 Standard lab equipment replacements.
  - UV Disinfection Equipment \$50,000 The UV disinfection system has been in operation since 2008. This line item will cover yearly bulb, bulb sleeve, electrical wiring, and mechanized bulb cleaner replacements. This unit is critical to the operations of the WWTP and is maintenance intensive.
  - Plant Valves and Piping \$75,000 This line item will cover the replacement of plug and gate valves throughout the WWTP as well as identified piping.
  - Flow Meter Station Electrical/Telecommunication Improvements \$10,000 This would cover improvements at one meter station to be identified by priority.

- Strainer for PW2 Water System \$50,000 The existing strainer is 30 years old and worn out. PW1 was replaced in FY19.
- Bar Nunn Lift Station No. 2 Generator Replacement \$90,000 The existing emergency generator located at the Bar Nunn No. 2 Lift Station is 31 years old and requires replacement. Riverwest generator was replaced in FY19.
- Primary Sludge Pump Replacement \$60,000 The three primary sludge pumps are utilized to pump primary sludge from the primary clarifiers to the gravity thickener. The existing piston pumps are 34 years old, are inefficient, and are requiring more frequent rebuilds. Staff is investigating different types of pumps for the replacement such as screw pumps or piston pumps.
- Aeration Basin Air Piping Recoating \$60,000 The existing coating system on the external piping is failing.
- HVAC System Replacements \$125,000 This is to replace HVAC units on the dewatering building. \$50,000 was budgeted in FY19 for this project, but bids came in way over the expected amount for a stainless steel unit.
- Secondary Building Concrete Repair \$300,000 Concrete repair identified in the WWTP Facilities Plan.
- MCC Replacements \$500,000 Additional Funding for the MCC replacement project designed in FY18. Fire Code issues will be addressed.
- Grit System No. 1 Rehabilitation \$90,000 This project is to replace the grit pump, cyclone, classifier, and associated piping of grit system No. 1. There are two grit systems, the second will be replaced in FY21.
- c) Intangibles None this year.
- d) Light Equipment \$145,000 This is for the following:
  - Unanticipated Equipment Replacements \$125,000 This is to replace critical equipment that fails unexpectedly during the year. This is an old Wastewater Treatment Plant where equipment will fail unexpectedly needing immediate replacement or renovation.
  - Utility Cart Replacement \$10,000 There are four utility carts used at the WWTP. This is to replace one utility cart.
  - Mower \$10,000 Riding mower replacement
- e) Heavy Equipment None this year.
- f) Technologies \$9,285 This represents
  - Computer Replacements \$7,500.
  - Munis Compatible Time Clock \$1,785 The City is switching financial software and the current time clock is not compatible with the new software.

#### Summary

The WWTP FY20 operations budget is 13.1% greater than the FY19 operations budget due to increased costs in Interdepartmental Services, Personnel, and Debt Service.

Major capital projects for FY20 include the North Platte Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation Project and the Secondary Building Concrete Repairs.

The total FY20 WWTP budget shows a surplus of approximately \$1.8 M. Subtracting out grant/loan funding anticipated to be received in FY20 (\$1.5 M) allocated to prior projects leaves a surplus of \$300,000.

On the horizon, in the next 10 - 15 years, major process changes may be necessary at the WWTP to accommodate Nutrient and Selenium removal due to regulatory action.

Vice Chairman Catellier asked how the river was delisted. Mr. Martin stated that the Natrona County Conservation District did years of sampling and assisted farmers in changing from flood irrigation to sprinkler irrigation.

Vice Chairman Catellier asked why the MCC Replacement Project was not completed this year. Mr. Martin stated that issues were discovered with the secondary treatment that were of a higher priority.

Mr. Martin reviewed the FY20 Budget Computation of 201 Regional Wastewater System Charges with the Committee.

Mr. Martin stated that Other Capital Requirements includes loan payments.

Mr. Martin stated that Direct Costs for Operation & Maintenance increased from FY19 due to Personnel and Interdepartmental Charges.

Mr. Martin stated that Wastewater Collection expenses increased \$83,000 over FY19.

Mr. Martin stated that Replacement Capital Expenses increased \$150,000 over FY19.

Mr. Martin stated that the Percent of Administration Costs allocated to RWWS decreased from FY19 due to a change in the allocation of budget funding.

Mr. Martin stated that the Total 201 Charges to be Allocated is \$5,729,439, which is an increase of \$277,000, or 5.1%.

Mr. Martin stated that the anticipated costs to each Agency for FY20 are based on percentage of flows from January 2018 – December 2018.

5. Mr. Martin turned the time over to Ms. Megan Lockwood, WWTP Manager, for the WWTP Operations Update.

Ms. Lockwood stated that WWTP Operations is down one employee, the advertised position just closed and interviews will be held next week. Ms. Lockwood stated that a night operator will move to days, and the new operator will be on nights.

Ms. Lockwood stated that the newest operator recently passed his DEQ Level III Operator License.

Ms. Lockwood stated that the WWTP had an upset in February and March but returned to full compliance in April.

Ms. Lockwood stated that the WDEQ Audit inspection was earlier this week; it went very well and there were no issues.

Ms. Lockwood stated that the Maintenance Staff rebuilt one DAFT tank with new flights and will rebuild the other tank.

Ms. Lockwood stated that one of the low pressure blowers is out of service and a replacement is in the process of being procured.

Ms. Lockwood stated that parts for the UV system are also in the process of being procured.

Ms. Lockwood stated that the Industrial Pretreatment Supervisor is reviewing the Local Limits as part of the new WDEQ Discharge Permit. Mr. Martin stated that this was also done a couple of years ago. Mr. Martin stated that if there are changes that need made, it will be done by Ordinance which will be sent to all the RWWS entities.

Ms. Lockwood stated that the Industrial Pretreatment Supervisor is working with the FireRock on a grease issue they have had. Ms. Lockwood stated that they may have to replace their grease interceptor.

Ms. Lockwood stated that the WWTP produced 1,200 dry metric tons of biosolids in 2018 which was used by the Landfill as cover.

Committee Member Bogart asked for an update on Shawn's Johns. Ms. Lockwood stated that they are currently not allowed to dump at the WWTP due to nonpayment of their bill.

#### 6. In Project Updates:

a) Mr. Martin stated that the WWTP Emergency Power Project has been awarded to ITC Electrical Technologies and is under construction. Mr. Martin stated that this project is for one generator at the head of the WWTP and will replace three old generators. Mr. Martin stated that there have been delays with the project construction.

- b) Mr. Martin stated that the design of the MCC Replacement Project is underway by Jacobs (CH2M). Mr. Martin stated that this project will be completed after the Secondary Process Project.
- c) Mr. Martin stated that the Boiler Installation Project is to install a new boiler to heat the digesters. Mr. Martin stated that this project is having the same issues with the updated Fire Code. Mr. Martin stated that the Digester Control Building must have six air changes per hour and a new HVAC system may be required. Mr. Martin stated that bids came in at \$834,000, which is significantly over budget. Mr. Martin stated that all bids were rejected for the project. Mr. Martin stated that the project will be rebid, and it might be combined with another project.
- d) Mr. Martin stated that the Secondary Rehabilitation Project is under design by Jacobs. Mr. Martin stated that this project includes replacing RAS Room piping and valves in the secondary treatment building, and installation of isolation gates in the aeration basins. Mr. Martin stated that a section of the steel pipe is in poor condition and needs replaced. Mr. Martin stated that this is a critical replacement and design estimates the project to be \$2.4 M. Mr. Martin stated that the project should be completed in October 2020.
- 7. A motion was made by Vice Chairman Catellier and seconded by Committee Member Haigler to adjourn the meeting at 10:42 a.m. Motion passed.

#### **Budget Narrative**

Find below the narrative regarding the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) Budget for Fiscal Year 2021.

The Public Utilities Division made serious efforts to minimize increases and institute decreases where possible in the FY21 WWTP operations budget. Due to these efforts, the operations budget is 6.2% lower than the FY20 operations budget.

The WWTP Budget is driven by new and replacement capital projects much more than by operational expenditures. The new and replacement capital expenditures generally follow the WWTP Fund Capital Improvement Plan (CIP). The CIP has been updated to contain projects identified in the recent WWTP Preliminary Facilities Plan. There are carryover capital projects in the FY21 budget from FY20 because of delays in obtaining regulatory approval for projects and/or delays in engineering design caused by project complexity, and/or funding acquisition problems.

### **Wastewater Treatment Plant Budget**

#### Revenue

- a) Septic Tank/Commercial Sump Waste Charges \$350,000 and \$120,000 This represents a \$40,000 increase for the Septic Tank Waste Charge revenue and status quo for Sump Waste Charge revenue. These projections have been made based on FY20 budget actuals.
- b) Intergovernmental User Charges \$5,629,924 These revenues are budgeted for wholesale sewer usage of the Regional Wastewater System in accordance to the cost accounting formula in the "Interagency Agreement". There are eleven wholesale customers of the Regional Wastewater System.

#### Personnel Services

a) Personnel Costs – \$1,478,265 – This is an increase of \$32,365 from the FY20 budget. There have been some personnel cost decreases due to a couple of newer employees at a lower certification level, no one time bonuses, and the elimination of accrued leave pay-off. Overall, the personnel line has increased due mainly to increased health insurance costs.

#### Materials and Supplies

- a) General Supplies and Materials \$138,500 This amount is unchanged from the FY20 budget. General supplies and materials includes the following:
  - \$ 3,000 Office Supplies
  - \$ 5,000 Misc Supplies
  - \$10,000 Safety Equipment and Supplies
  - \$ 8,500 Lubricants
  - \$60,000 Machinery Supplies
  - \$ 5,000 Small Tools and Supplies
  - \$12,000 Lab Supplies
  - \$35,000 Other Structures/Building Supplies
- b) Postage and Printing \$1,500 This amount is unchanged from the FY20 budget.
- c) Electricity \$350,000 This amount is unchanged from the FY20 budget.
- d) Natural Gas \$71,000 This amount is unchanged from the FY20 budget.
- e) Gas/Fuel \$14,980 This amount is a decrease of \$1,020 from the FY20 budget.
- f) Chemicals \$348,000 This represents a decrease of \$84,000 from the FY20 budget.
- g) Lift Station Supplies \$14,000 This represents a \$6,000 decrease from the FY20 budget.

#### Contractual Services

- a) Professional Services \$25,000 This amount is unchanged from the FY20 budget. This line is for instrumentation repair.
- b) Investment Services \$14,516 This is an increase of \$3,792 from the FY20 budget.
- c) Maintenance Agreements \$21,160 This amount is unchanged from the FY20 budget. The line includes the following:
  - \$4,560 CMMS Software

- \$2,400 Operations Data Tracking Software
- \$1,000 Laser Alignment Tool Calibration
- \$1,000 Fire Sprinkler System Inspection
- \$1,200 Fire Extinguisher Inspection/Exchange
- \$3,000 HVAC Service
- \$3,500 Crane Inspections
- \$1,500 Copier Maintenance/Lease
- \$1,000 Lab Equipment Certification
- \$2,000 Instrumentation Contractual
- d) Other Contractual \$39,500 This amount is unchanged from the FY20 budget. Other Contractual contains the following:
  - \$ 1,000 Legal Services
  - \$30,000 NCCD Funding Agreements
  - \$ 1,500 Railroad Easements
  - \$ 4,000 Other Misc. Contractual
  - \$ 3,000 Public Outreach
- c) Interdepartmental Services \$485,072 This is a \$26,158 decrease from the FY20 budget. This line item represents transfers to the General Fund for services such as Human Resources, Administrative Services (Billing & Collection), Information Technology, GIS Services, City Attorney Fees, Buildings & Grounds, Central Records, Central Garage, and City Administration Fees.
- f) Laundry and Towel Service \$8,000 This amount is unchanged from the FY20 budget.
- g) Testing \$30,000 This amount is unchanged from the FY20 budget and is for DEQ/EPA lab testing requirements.

#### Other Costs

- a) Travel/Training \$7,500 This amount is unchanged from the FY20 budget.
- b) Insurance and Bonds \$30,734 This is a \$1,088 increase from the FY20 budget.

#### <u>Utility Expense</u>

a) Communication - \$28,800 – This amount is unchanged from the FY20 budget.

#### Debt Service

a) Principal Payment – \$715,931 – This reflects the Principal amounts for four CWSRF loans per the amortization schedules.

- CWSRF Loan #27 (2008 WWTP Imp.) -\$ 552,810
   CWSRF Loan #128 (Biosolids Turner) -\$ 13,737
   CWSRF Loan #127 (Phase 1 WWTP Imp) -\$ 90,802

- b) Interest Expense \$344,967 This reflects the Interest expense for CWSRF loans per the amortization schedules.

     CWSRF Loan #127 (Phase 1 WWTP Imp) -\$ 122,278

#### Capital Revenues

- a) State Loans \$8,000,000 This represents the following:
  - CWSRF Loan NPSS Rehabilitation
- b) System Development Charges \$190,000 This amount is unchanged from the FY20 budget.

#### Capital – New

- a) Improvements Other Than Buildings None for FY21.
- b) Intangibles \$50,000 Based on recommendations from the March 2019 Board meeting, this is a placeholder for potential projects brought forward by the Natrona County Conservation District.
- c) Light Equipment None for FY21.
- d) There are no budget expenditures for New Capital Buildings, Heavy Equipment, or Technologies this year.

#### <u>Capital – Replacement</u>

- a) Buildings \$80,000 This is for the following:
  - Lighting Renovations \$10,000 This will upgrade lighting fixtures in several areas of the facility.
  - Security Improvements \$30,000 The installation of security enhancements for several City owned facilities including the WWTP took place in FY14. This will cover additional needs including secure doors to several of the buildings.
  - Digester Control Building Roof Replacement \$40,000 The Digester Control Building roof has passed its useful life and will be replaced in FY21.

- b) Improvements Other Than Buildings \$9,085,000 This includes:
  - NPSS Interceptor Project \$7,100,000 This project is to rehabilitate sections of the NPSS interceptor that were identified as in critical need of rehab in the 2012 NPSS assessment.
  - Sludge Grinder \$10,000 The WWTP has several sludge grinders used to shred sludge to make it easier to pump and not plug sludge lines.
  - UV Disinfection Equipment \$50,000 The UV Disinfection System has been in operation since 2008. This line item will cover yearly bulb, bulb sleeve, electrical wiring, and mechanized bulb cleaner replacements. This unit is critical to the operations of the WWTP.
  - Plant Valves and Piping \$75,000 This line item will cover the replacement of plug and gate valves throughout the WWTP as well as identified piping.
  - Flow Meter Station Electrical/Telecommunication Improvements \$10,000 This would cover improvements at one meter station to be identified by priority.
  - Strainer for PW2 Water System \$50,000 The existing strainer is 30 years old and worn out.
  - Airport Lift Station No. 2 Generator Replacement \$90,000 The existing emergency generator located at the Airport Lift Station is 32 years old and requires replacement.
  - Primary Sludge Pump Replacement \$15,000 The three primary sludge pumps are utilized to pump primary sludge from the primary clarifiers to the gravity thickener. The existing piston pumps are 34 years old, are inefficient, and are requiring more frequent rebuilds.
  - Aeration Basin Air Piping Recoating \$70,000 The existing coating system on the external piping is failing
  - HVAC System Replacements \$150,000 This is to replace HVAC units on the dewatering building.
  - Grit System No. 2 Rehabilitation \$90,000 This project is to replace the grit pump, cyclone, classifier, and associated piping of Grit System No 2.
  - Sewage Lift Station Communication Upgrade \$25,000 This project is to upgrade five lift stations to radio communication.
  - Centrifuge Sludge Feed Pump Rebuild \$10,000
  - RAS Room Piping Replacement \$1,200,000 This project is re-budgeted from FY20 and is to replace the piping in the RAS room.
  - Gas Compressor #2 Replacement \$10,000
  - Turblex Blower Service \$40,000 Scheduled Manufacturer Service
  - Centrifuge #1 Rehabilitation \$90,000 Rehab damaged centrifuge
- c) Intangibles None this year.
- d) Light Equipment \$179,000 This is for the following:
  - Unanticipated Equipment Replacements \$125,000 This is to replace critical equipment that fails unexpectedly during the year. This is an old Wastewater

Treatment Plant where equipment will fail unexpectedly needing immediate replacement or renovation.

- Utility Cart Replacement \$12,000.
- Compost Aerator \$30,000 Skidsteer attachment for aerating the drying beds
- Roll-off Box Replacement \$12,000
- e) Heavy Equipment None this year.
- f) Technologies \$10,000 This is for computer replacements

#### **Summary**

The WWTP FY21 operations budget is 6.2% lower than the FY20 operations budget primarily due to decreases in chemical, interdepartmental, fuel, and lift station supply costs.

Capital projects for FY21 include the NPSS Interceptor Project, the RAS Room Piping Replacement Project, and several smaller dollar equipment replacement projects.

The total FY21 WWTP budget shows a surplus of approximately \$800,000. After subtracting out \$900,000 of funding for previously budgeted projects, the FY21 budget shows a deficit of \$100,000. Based on the most recent rate model, WWTP Fund Reserves will be approximately \$5.3 M at the end of FY21. The minimum required reserves per the CPU Minimum Fund Reserve Policy is \$3.9 M.

On the horizon, in the next 10 - 15 years, major process changes may be necessary at the WWTP to accommodate Nutrient and Selenium removal due to regulatory action.

#### **Summary**

The Federal Industrial Pretreatment Program (part of the Clean Water Act) requires Industrial Dischargers and Municipalities to use treatment techniques and management practices to reduce or eliminate the discharge of harmful pollutants to sanitary sewers and wastewater treatment plants. The allowable amount of metals discharged to the sewer system is set by "Local Limits", which are contained in City Ordinances. The original Industrial Pretreatment Ordinances were adopted by the City in 1984. In 1999, these Sections were substantially revised in order to comply with new Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requirements. In 2007, and again in 2016, more modest revisions were made.

The Wastewater Treatment Plant discharge permit was renewed in November 2018. This permit renewal triggers the need for an evaluation of the exiting Local Limits. Staff, following EPA guidelines, compiled and submitted data that was used in determining new Local Limits. EPA has approved the new limits and staff is now in the process of updating Casper Ordinances to reflect these changes. Once completed, the new limits will need to be adopted by all Regional Wastewater System members as well. The following table shows existing and proposed limits:



### Fort Caspar to Reopen June 8th

The museum will begin a phased reopening with some restrictions in place for health and safety.

Casper, Wyoming (June 4, 2020) – Fort Caspar Museum is pleased to announce that we will begin a phased reopening of the museum and fort on Monday, June 8<sup>th</sup>. Following CDC, state, and local health and safety guidelines, we will have restrictions in place to protect our visitors and staff. There will also be some modifications to our operating hours: we will be open 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday. From 9:00 am to 10:00 am, we will allow admission to high-risk visitors only.

All on-site programs and tours are cancelled, but we will continue to offer monthly history programs online for kids and families. This virtual opportunity is a collaboration between Fort Caspar Museum and the National Historic Trails Center. Hands-on History Club is accessed by a code generated after you make a reservation; please see our website or call for more information.

Preventative procedures in the museum include a thorough cleaning each morning; high-touch surfaces and restrooms will be cleaned and disinfected on a regular basis throughout the day. Staff will be wearing face coverings, and we encourage visitors to wear them as well when in the museum. Sanitation stations will be available so that visitors may use sanitizer as they enter and leave the facility. Even so, we ask that you refrain from touching displays and other surfaces during your visit. Directional signs will encourage a one-way flow through the galleries, and we ask that six-feet of distance be maintained between people who are not traveling together.

Group sizes are limited to 25 people. Groups of any size should explore the museum together and stay six feet away from other visitors. Children must remain with their family group. We are still accepting indoor and outdoor facility rentals at this time as long as they comply with current guidelines.

Of course, if you are experiencing any symptoms that are typical signs of a Covid-19 infection—such as a cough, high temperature, body aches, chills, sore throat, breathing difficulty, and/or loss of taste or smell—please stay home.

Fort Caspar Museum's hours during the phased reopening are 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday, with 9:00 am to 10:00 am reserved for those at high risk. The fort buildings will close a half hour before the museum, at 4:30 pm. Admission prices are \$4 for adults; \$3 for youth (ages 13-18 years) and seniors (ages 62 and over); and free for children (12 years and younger) and for FCMA members. #### An Open Letter from the Casper Police Chief to Our Community

June 1st, 2020

We are angry too.

George Floyd did not deserve to die.

We have all seen the horrific video footage of George Floyd's tragic death. We've seen it and we are appalled. We are disgusted that someone trusted to protect and serve others as a police officer would so callously treat another human in this way.

But, that is not who we are – we are Casper.

As citizens of Casper, you may be looking at your police department and wondering if a situation like what happened in Minneapolis could ever happen here.

What happened in Minneapolis is not a representation of your police department. It is against the very fundamentals of our mission as we protect and serve Casper with the highest professionalism in police services – and, it's against who we are. It is, however, an opportunity for us to learn. We never want this to happen in our community and we are dedicated beyond measure to ensuring that it doesn't.

Last week, I commissioned a critical review of the death of George Floyd and created a meaningful discussion forum for every one of our police officers. We reviewed the heartbreaking video footage of George Floyd and together we are having important conversations regarding race and our role as police officers to help – not hinder – the progress that needs to be made in our country.

If we resort to using force on a citizen, it is thoroughly reviewed and investigated. We seek ways to improve and learn. Any complaint we receive, regardless of how it is received, or who it is received from, is rigorously reviewed and investigated.

It is against our policy and our beliefs to wait idly by when another officer is acting outside of our values. When we see something wrong, we act and we are accountable – even if we are the ones at fault.

We spend hundreds of thousands of dollars every year training our officers on many subjects – including implicit bias and how to safely and humanely take individuals into custody. We train, and then we do it again, and again, and again.

As a member of our community, you should know that your police officers are honest, they have integrity, and they treat all people with respect. These are *your* police officers. They hold as sacred their dedication to the protection and safety of Casper, honoring it with the gravity it deserves.

I ask that you continue to trust the members of the Casper Police Department: the men and women behind the badge that work tirelessly every day to earn and maintain your trust. Together, we, as a community, can learn from the past, and commit to a better future. We stand with you in a call for change and a better tomorrow. At the Casper Police Department, we remain steadfast in our commitment to improving every day.

The Casper Police Department dedicates significant portions of its budget and resources to ensure that we are constantly representing our community in the most professional way. Even in these difficult economic times, and at a time when we are consistently working short-handed, we have still consecrated six, full-time staff, including a Lieutenant, two Sergeants, and three veteran officers, to ensure our police force is an ethical, well-trained, professional Police Department.

We hear the nation's cry to do better at identifying and removing from our ranks the police officers who do not live up to our society's expectations and to our Department's lofty standards. We despise bad officers more than anyone.

Every candidate for a police officer position with the Casper Police Department undergoes a rigorous and exhaustive process to ensure we are hiring the right type of person to serve our citizens. Each candidate is subjected to an exhaustive background investigation. We talk to their family members, spouses, and even ex-spouses. We go to their community and we meet their neighbors, employers, and associates. We review their social media history, and also that of their 'friends', for inappropriate material or evidence of opinions or beliefs contrary to our standards. We speak to every police agency in every city they have ever lived in. We review their credit to ensure they are accountable to their obligations. We review their entire life history. We then meet face-to-face with them to make sure we *personally* believe they are a good match for our community.

The few that survive the background investigation are then subjected to even more intrusive testing and evaluation. Each candidate undergoes a thorough, 7-step, psychological evaluation by trained industry experts in the field of mental health who specialize in looking for mal-adaptive behaviors, psychopathy, and mental illness, as well as the candidate's capacity to learn and adapt to our community's standards and the rigors of a law enforcement career. No candidate is considered who cannot meet these demanding standards.

Remaining candidates are then subjected to a comprehensive polygraph evaluation to ensure they have been truthful throughout the entire process. Our polygraph process eliminates candidates even when all else has indicated they appear to be an excellent choice for our community.

In the end, for every one hundred applications we receive, on average, only two make it through the process to serve you, the incredible people of Casper, Wyoming.

Our ability to protect and serve our community can only be done if the people of this community trust we will do the right thing with the responsibility we have been given. We strive every day to prove to you that you can count on us. We join you in a call for a change and a better tomorrow.

We support the rights of our citizens to safely and publically express their outrage. More importantly, we encourage and welcome our community to join with their police department in facilitating the productive dialogue that will be required to create enduring change.
